Civil Casualties: Local Civilian Experiences during the American Revolution

Much has been written about the Philadelphia campaign, its individual battles and Valley Forge. But what many do not realize is that much of what determined those events was grounded in local civilian life and circumstances. This talk will introduce you to the Quaker aspects and sufferings during the war; the complex issues of food, clothing and medical supplies during the campaigns and battles; and the reasons why the armies fought here.



Nancy V. Webster, a Delaware County native, is the Curator-Historian of the national Friends Historical Association and Honorary Curator at Swarthmore College. For over twenty years she has served as the Secretary-Treasurer for the Fellows in American Studies. With her extensive background in museum work and historic preservation, Nancy has presented professionally on a wide range of topics in thirty-eight states and four foreign countries.
